## Auction 254

The catalogue featuring world coins and medals consists of 500 lots. Among other things, it will contain the collection of an aesthete. This collector bears the name quite rightly. He chose his coins carefully and with a lot of knowledge, paying close attention to the stylistic qualities of the die cut and the grade.

Aside from high-quality individual pieces, Gorny & Mosch will also offer three other collections. The first one revolves around the German States and has a special focus on Württemberg coins and medals. The second one concentrates on coins from modern Greece. And the third collection has its main focus on coins and medals from the Habsburg Dynasty, minted in the 19th and 20th century. The quality of this collection is remarkable and will surely satisfy every grade-fetishist, no matter how picky he or she might be.

No. 2018: BAVARIA. Maximilian III Joseph, 1745-1777. Gold medal of 12 ducats weight 1747, by F. A. Schega. On occasion of his wedding with Maria Anna Sophia of Saxony. From the collection of an aesthete. Very rare. Cut value mark at edge. Extremely fine. Estimate: 10,000 euros

No. 2047: HAMBURG. 1/2 Bank-Portugalese of 5 ducats weight 1803. Regeneration of the Hamburg "Assecuranz-Societät" (= Assurance Company). Extremely fine +. Estimate: 4,000 euros

No. 2060: MAGDEBURG. Augustus of Saxe-Weissenfels, 1638-1680. Gold medal of 30 ducats weight n. y. (1673), by J. G. Breyer. On occasion of the claim of Magdeburg and Jülich-Cleves. From the collection of an aesthete. Only known specimen of this weight. Extremely fine. Estimate: 40,000 euros

No. 2065: NUREMBERG. Taler 1658. Very rare, especially in this condition. Almost FDC. Estimate: 6,000 euros

No. 2091: SAXONY. Frederick August III / I, 1763-1827. Ducat 1806, Dresden. Almost FDC. Estimate: 5,000 euros

No. 2123: WÜRTTEMBERG. Frederick II / I, 1797-1816. Ducat 1808. Very rare. Extremely fine / extremely fine +. Estimate: 15,000 euros

No. 2154: WÜRTTEMBERG. Charles, 1864-1891. 5 mark 1874 f. Very rare in this condition Proof. Estimate: 12,500 euros

No. 2267: AUSTRO-HUNGARY. Maria Theresa, 1740-1780. Double souverain d'or 1773, Vienna. Minted for the Netherlands. Rare in this condition. Almost FDC. Estimate: 5,000 euros

No. 2319: AUSTRO-HUNGARY. Olomouc, Bishop. Karl II von Liechtenstein, 1664-1695. Double ducat 1680, Kroměříž. From the collection of an aesthete. Very rare. Extremely fine. Estimate: 15,000 euros

No. 2341: BELGIUM. Charles III (VI), 1703-1711 (-1740). Gold medal at 17 ducats 1720, by P. H. Roettiers. On occasion of the surrender of Ypres. From the collection of an aesthete. Very rare. Extremely fine. Estimate: 30,000 euros

No. 2363: GREECE. Ioannis Kapodistrias, 1827-1831. Phoenix 1828, Aegina. FDC. Estimate: 4,000 euros

No. 2419: POLAND. John II Casimir, 1648-1668. 3 ducats n. y. (1650). From the collection of an aesthete. Very rare. Almost FDC. Estimate: 10,000 euros

No. 2432: RUSSIA. Paul I, 1796-1801. Gold medal for merit n. y., signed by Leberecht. To princes and voivodes for their imperial services. From the Antonin Radmanovic collection. Only known specimen. Very fine. Estimate: 25,000 euros

No. 2458: RUSSIA. Order of Saint Anna. 1st model, Coss 3rd Class (since 1815). Very rare. Edition in gold only 150 specimens. Very fine +. Estimate: 10,000 euros

No. 2462: SWEDEN. Ulrica Eleonora, 1718-1728. Gold medal at 30 ducats 1719 by J. C. Hedlinger. On occasion of her coronation. From the collection of an aesthete. Probably the only known specimen in gold. Estimate: 40,000 euros

No. 2464: SWITZERLAND. Solothurn. Taler 1561. Very rare. Extremely fine. Estimate: 12,500 euros

No. 2486: HAITI. Republic, since 1804. Trial piece at 30 sols 1808, Birmingham. From polished dies. FDC. Estimate: 2,500 euros
