For the second time, coins of the Roman provinces from the Collection of the German ancient historian and epigrapher Peter Weiß, which was built up in the years between 1967 and 2015, will be on offer. Furthermore, auction 280 contains 30 published coins (plate coins) that are depicted with images by M. & A. Hirmer in the reference works "Die Griechische Münze" (P. Franke, M. Hirmer) and "Die Römische Münze" (J. Kent, B. Overbeck, A. Stylow).

No. 709: ROMAN EMPIRE. Constantine I, the Great, AD 307-337. Solidus ø 17mm (4.56g). AD 312-313. Mint of Treveris. **Gold! RR!** Extremely fine. Estimate: 25,000 euros

No. 1287: FREE IMPERIAL CITY OF FRIEDBERG. Imperial city coinage. Double taler 1591. With the title of Emperor Rudolf II. Extremely rare! RRRR! Traces of gilding, extremely fine. Estimate: 80,000 euros
